

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENT UNIFORM

The Macquarie Uniform is smart and distinctive. The way that students wear their uniform is a powerful statement about their personal standards and by inference also a symbol of our school's corporate standards and aspirations. It is expected that students will wear their uniform with pride and distinction at all times. Parents are urged to support our uniform policy by purchasing the correct uniform items, and by ensuring that students come to school each day in full school uniform.

All uniform items should be neat, clean and in good repair. Students are expected to travel to and from school in their correct school uniform, regardless of whether they are using public or private transport.

Below is the current list of uniform items:

Summer Uniform

- (Junior Girls) School dress (length below the knee), white fold down ankle socks, black lace up school shoes*, wide brim school hat.
- (Senior Girls) Navy skirt (length below the knee), white crested short sleeved shirt, navy tie (different tie for Years 11 and 12), white fold down ankle socks, black lace up shoes*, Senior "Natasha" wide brim School hat.
- (Junior Boys) Grey Junior School shorts, white crested short sleeved shirt, School tie, School grey socks, black lace up shoes*, wide brim School hat.
- (Senior Boys) Grey Senior School shorts, white crested short sleeved shirt, School tie (different tie for Years 11 and 12), School grey socks, black lace up shoes*, Senior "Akubra" wide brim School hat.

*Shoes should be a black leather (not suede or boot), lace up school shoe with a flat heel. Black leather joggers are not acceptable.

Summer Sport Uniform

Macquarie sport polo shirt (not required to be tucked in), school sport shorts, white school sport ankle socks, sport lace up sports shoes, Macquarie sport cap or bucket hat.

Winter Uniform

- (Junior Girls) School pinafore (length below the knee), white long sleeved shirt, navy tie, navy School jumper with crest, navy 70 denier tights or over the knee socks, black lace up school shoes*, wide brim School hat.
- (Senior Girls) Tartan School skirt (length below the knee), white crested long sleeved shirt, navy tie, navy School jumper with crest, navy 70 denier tights or over the knee socks, black lace up school shoes*, Senior "Natasha" wide brim School hat. Blazer to be worn to and from School and for all assemblies, chapels and formal occasions.
- (Junior Boys) Grey junior School long pants, white crested long sleeved shirt, School tie, navy School jumper with crest, School grey socks, black lace up shoes*, wide brim School hat.
- (Senior Boys) Grey senior School long pants, white crested long sleeved shirt, School tie, navy School jumper with crest, School grey socks, black lace up shoes*, Senior "Akubra" wide brim School hat. Blazer to be worn to and from School and for all assemblies, chapels and formal occasions.

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- Shoes should be a black leather (not suede or boot), lace up school shoe with a flat heel. Black leather joggers are not acceptable.
- Optional – Macquarie Scarf (this is the only scarf to be worn)
- Students may only wear plain navy gloves.

Winter Sport Uniform

Macquarie sport polo shirt (not required to be tucked in), School sport tracksuit, white School sport ankle socks, sport lace up sports shoes, Macquarie sport cap or bucket hat, School sport jersey.

School Uniform Guidelines

1. All clothing should be kept in a good state of repair and clearly labelled.
2. Summer Uniform will be worn during Terms 1 and 4.
3. Winter Uniform will be worn during Terms 2 and 3. All Junior and Senior School students must have an approved Macquarie School bag.
5. All clothing should be of a modest fit. For both female Junior and Senior School students, hems are to be no shorter than the base of the knee.
6. Boys shirts are to be tucked in with all buttons done up. Ties are to be neatly tied with the length to the top of the waistband. Ties are only to be removed and top buttons undone on advice of the Headmaster or delegate.
7. The School jumper is to be worn with formal School uniform only. This means that students are not permitted to wear the jumper with their sport uniform.
8. Shoes should be black leather (not suede or boot), lace up school shoe with a flat heel. Black leather joggers are not acceptable.
9. Sport shoes are those designed for running and outdoor exercise activities. They should be only be worn on sport days. Slipper style shoes and hi-top sneakers are not permitted. Velcro is appropriate for K-2 students.
10. Students should maintain a high standard of personal hygiene and grooming at all times.
11. Hairstyles are not to restrict a student's vision. Boys' hair is to be no longer than the bottom edge of the collar. Hair should be neatly cut and groomed. Hair colouring and hair styles that attract undue attention is not permitted. e.g. rats tail and or shavings. Girls' hair, shoulder length or longer, is to be tied up neatly. Only navy, white or black hair accessories are allowed. Hair colouring that attracts undue attention is not permitted. Please note that the final decision on hair suitability will rest with the Headmaster or delegate.
12. Fingernail polish is not allowed.
13. Jewellery that is permitted is: one watch, sleepers or plain studs (one earring per ear). Boys are not permitted to wear piercings of any description. Year 11 and 12 students are also allowed one small plain ring, necklace and small bracelet.
14. Make up that attracts undue attention is not permitted. Please note that the final decision on make up suitability will rest with the Headmaster or delegate.

15. Undergarments such as singlet tops should be flesh colour or white. Such garments should not be visible when wearing uniform.
16. The appropriate School hat should be worn whenever students are outdoors.
17. The School Sport Uniform for both Junior and Senior school may be worn to and from school on the weekly Sport Day and on day(s) when a student has a practical PDHPE lesson. Year 12 are permitted to wear Sport Uniform on Fridays where permitted by the Head of Senior School.
18. On “Mufti days” students are permitted to wear non–uniform clothing and will be given clear guidelines regarding appropriate attire. Money so raised is used either for a special school project or donated to a chosen charity.
19. The Uniform Shop (on site) will be open on Tuesday 8:15am to 10:15am and 2:30pm to 4:00pm and Thursday from 8.15am to 10:15am.
20. If for a valid reason a student is unable to wear their full uniform, this should be noted in the student’s diary and signed by the parent/caregiver. Students will not be permitted to come to school out of uniform for long periods of time.
